Preparing 8th Grade Students for the Transition to PHS

This marking period is a busy time for our soon-to-be high school students! While we definitely do not want them to get "senioritis" already, we have many things set in place to help with the first steps in this transition.

In preparation for the upcoming PHS Career Technical Education (CTE) visits, 8th grade Career Day, and the 4-year planning process for high school, Mrs. Kelley and Mrs. Pinney worked with students last week on career and college exploration.

To help you and your child navigate this new and exciting territory, we encourage parents of 8th graders to attend the **PHS Parent Curriculum Meeting on February 6th** where high school counselors and administrators will be explaining their 2025-26 course offerings and scheduling process, as well as going over graduation requirements and answering questions.

This Thursday, February 6, PHS counselors will be presenting information about 4-year EDP's (Educational Development Plan) to all 8th grade students. Students will receive information about graduation requirements, high school course sequences, and elective/CTE opportunities. They will be given a blank EDP and other information to begin developing their 4-year plan to tentatively map out their high school course paths. While preliminary course selections are not set in stone and will be revisited each year of high school, we ask that parents approve their child's class selection for the 2025-26 school year so that they may be scheduled into those classes before spring break. The information we send home will also be available in Schoology, titled *"Welcome to Petoskey High School: Scheduling."*

On February 13, the entire 8th grade will walk over to Petoskey High School to visit and observe the CTE class offerings, which will be available to them beginning next year. PHS student tour guides and CTE teachers will explain the various programs and answer any questions.

In March, we will hold our annual 8th grade Career Day during which over 20 members of our community will share their professional experiences and expertise with our students. After Petoskey Police Chief Rocky Karr's keynote address, each eighth grader will rotate through four different career sessions, which are assigned in large part based on your child's interest and preference. That event runs from 8:30 - 11:00 on Wednesday, March 12.

After spring break, 8th graders will be taking the PSAT8, the state-mandated test in reading and math. This will be your child's first opportunity to take a practice SAT. The test will be administered from a digital platform, similar to the standardized tests students have taken in the past. Look for more information in the March newsletter!



Sports Physicals

DROP OFF / PICK UP PROCEDURES

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.

Also, please do not block Handicap parking spaces!





WHO CAN ATTEND? Camp Kesem serves
