School Safety - ALICE Training Update

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The safety and welfare of our students and staff remain our highest priority at the Public Schools of Petoskey. We are dedicated to creating a secure environment where students can focus on learning and growth. To that end, we continue to make significant strides in improving school safety through both enhanced building measures and ongoing training for our students and staff.

As part of our 2023 bond project, we are enhancing safety across the district with key improvements, including the installation of secure vestibules, protective window film, and camera upgrades. We are also integrating the CrisisGo platform to streamline communication during emergencies.

This fall, we completed the first phase of equipping all staff with ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) protocols. This nationally recognized options-based program is designed to better prepare schools in the unlikely event of an active shooter situation.

The next phase of our initiative involves introducing students to ALICE protocols over the coming months. This training will be delivered in an age-appropriate manner, ensuring students feel empowered and secure without causing unnecessary worry.

We are fortunate to collaborate with the Petoskey Department of Public Safety and other county law enforcement agencies in this effort. Their expertise, along with the guidance of our two dedicated school resource officers, Officer Ben Carlson and Officer Larry Donovan, ensures that our training is both comprehensive and effective.

If you have any questions about the training or our overall safety initiatives, please feel free to contact your building principal. We value your input and are here to address any concerns.

We look forward to continuing our partnership with families, Petoskey Department of Public Safety, and community agencies to provide the safest possible learning environment for every student.

Thank you for your ongoing support. Together, we can ensure our schools remain a place of safety, growth, and achievement.



<u>Immunizations</u>

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be up-to-date on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. If you have any questions, call the Health Department at 347-6014.

Medications

If your student has prescription or non-prescription medicine that they take during the school day, a medication form must be completed for each medication and the medicine dropped off by an adult to the school office. A new form must be filled out each school year.

DROP OFF / PICK UP PROCEDURES

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen



Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.

Also, please do not block Handicap parking spaces!




Students crossing Northmen Drive at any time should use the tunnels!
